grades 6-12.

YCAPP is an alternative to suspension for students in grades 6 to 12. The program is designed to help students move beyond the incident that resulted in a need for an alternative setting. The mission of YCAPP is to help each student accept responsibility for their actions, create a plan for restitution and empower them with tools for the future.

The four cornerstones of the YCAPP program are:

1. Academics
2. Self-reflection
3. Restorative justice
4. Student empowerment

Daily schedule

- Work on academic material and homework from missed classes
- Participate in restorative justice activities
- Participate in physical activities

YCAPP specifically works with building staff, principals and counselors to help students transition from the YCAPP program back into their designated schools. There is an emphasis on having students take responsibility for past actions in order to willingly move forward, restore damaged relationships, connect with adults for continued success, and to ultimately change the trajectory of their academic, social and emotional path in school and in life.

Community Partners

In order for YCAPP to be successful, a community collaborative was established. The school district's main partner, the Youth Service Bureau, is a community supported agency offering professional counselling assistance and diversion services to young people and their families.

YCAPP Student Information

- YCAPP hours are 7:50 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- Stillwater Area High School students will take the shuttle bus at 7:30 a.m to YCAPP
 - Snail bus on the way to school
 - Ball bus on the way back to the high school
- Oak-Land and Stillwater Middle School students must be transported by a parent/guardian. Drop off at door 21W. Pick up at door 17N.
- Students can bring a lunch, or hot/cold lunch can be ordered using same pin # as home school lunch.
- Cell phones will be collected upon arrival.
- Computers are provided.
- All backpacks will be searched before entering the classroom.
- Students will sign a behavioral contract upon entering the program.
- Medications at YCAAP require a doctor's order on record at the student's school. Parents will need to deliver the medication in a pharmacy labeled container to YCAPP. Please send only the amount required.
