


## 2019-2020 Stillwater Elementary 5th Grade Choice Board Week 2 (April 6-10)

- Students should choose **one** activity from each column (Math, Reading, Writing, Sci/Social and Specials) each day.
- This is meant to be a week’s worth of activity; it may be overwhelming for your child to do more than one activity per column per day.
- The same activity can be done more than once, should a student choose to do so.
- Use your judgment on a day-to-day basis about what level of engagement your child can handle. You may need to adjust the level of expectation on a particular day.
- Teachers will not be collecting or grading these activities. They will be sending a prompt or question each day via SeeSaw. Students will be asked to respond to the daily prompt/question. This is meant to be a quick two-way communication to measure engagement.

<p>Create ten double-digit addition problems and solve. Ex. <math>23+24=</math>__</p> <p>Make 10 multiplication flashcards for the 7’s and practice them.</p>	<p>Read for 30 minutes. Find and write down at least 2 words you don’t know the meaning of. Use context clues and all other strategies you’ve learned to figure out the meaning. Lastly, look it up if you can, and check if you are close!</p>	<p>Journal for 15 minutes about what you have done today, use details and descriptive words (use nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs). Add figurative language (i.e., simile, metaphor, personification, onomatopoeia). Take 10 more minutes to go back to add more details or to improve your word choice.</p>	<p>Friction and Wedges: Make 3 paper airplanes and modify each one so that they are unique. Make a graph to record the travel distance for each plane and throw each plane at least twice.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>PE</u></b></p> <p>Plank for 1 minute or more Push-ups (5 sets of 5) Curl-ups or sit-ups (5 sets 10) Run in place for 1 minute 5 times or go outside and run around your apartment, house, residence 5 times.</p>
<p>Create ten double-digit subtraction problems and solve. Ex. <math>44-23=</math>__</p> <p>Make 10 multiplication flashcards for the 8’s and practice them.</p>	<p>Read for 30 minutes from any fiction or poetry book. Look for figurative language examples that you have learned about. Write down as many as you can, try to figure out their meaning, and come up with drawings to match the meaning for two of them.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Poem Time!</p> <p>This poem doesn’t have to rhyme (but it can!) Write an 8 line poem that describes your thoughts and emotions about distance learning and how it has affected your daily life. Use vivid words and figurative language.</p>	<p>Science Journaling: Pick a plant or animal in your home environment. Name 3 adaptations and write a paragraph for each about why you think the adaptation is helpful for that plant or animal.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Art</u></b></p> <p>Collect three objects in your house (make sure you remember where to put them back!), trace them on a paper of your choice and use the shapes to create a new piece of artwork using marker, pencil and/or crayon.</p>
<p>Create ten double-digit multiplication problems and solve. Ex. <math>23 \times 44 =</math>__</p> <p>Make 10 multiplication flashcards for the 9’s and practice them.</p>	<p>Reading is everywhere! Investigate the print around you to see what you can learn. Read food labels, directions, magazines, books, or subtitles on a TV show. Write a paragraph reflecting on the role of written text in our daily lives.</p>	<p>Challenge: Perform a daily chore without being asked to do so. Now give a written description of a parent/guardian’s reaction when they discover the task has been completed!</p>	<p>Science Data: Line Graph In a notebook or on a piece of paper, record the high temperature for the next 7 days (or use the one provided). Now create a line graph to display data. Put time across the <b>x axis</b> (bottom), and temperature on the <b>y axis</b> (left side).</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Music</u></b></p> <p>Sing along with your favorite song playing.</p>

<p>Create ten triple-digit addition problems and solve them. Ex <math>423+222=</math> ___</p> <p>Skip count by 5's to 50 Skip count by 4's to 50 Write them down!</p>	<p>Read any fiction book/chapter. Create a storyboard or comic strip on the main events/plot of the book or chapter. You can add character interaction and setting descriptions with illustrations. Make a choice of adding two of the following: Highlight the main idea, add dialogue, portray an event, highlight a conflict, etc.</p>	<p>Invent a superhero with 3 powers. Write one paragraph about each power.</p>	<p>Spring Time! Take a picture or draw a picture of the first plant you saw that has turned green. (no pine trees allowed) Write or type one paragraph about why you think that plant is ahead of the others.</p>	<p><b>Media</b> Choose 1 Option: -Spend 20 minutes on code.org or SCRATCH. -Spend 20 minutes reading any book of choice.</p>

Ex. <math>423-222=</math> ___</p> <p>Skip count by 7's to 100 Skip count by 8's to 100 Write them down!</p>	<p>Complete a Venn diagram to compare and contrast characters, settings, plot, or themes. Use 2 books/chapters or a movie compared to a book.</p> 	<p>Choose a line or sentence that interests you from something you've read. Build on the original idea. Describe what else might have happened that the author didn't include. Change perspective or tense. Draw what you are thinking.</p>	<p>Social Studies Journaling: Write a paragraph from each point of view describing why your side is correct. Patriots (those who in favor of being independent from Britain) and Loyalists (the new Americans who were still loyal to Britain)</p>	<p><b>Bonus</b> Write a thank you letter to a doctor, nurse, custodian, or food-service worker at Lakeview Hospital.
